1. Approval of Minutes:

Motion made by Chris Hunter, seconded by Ron Aiken to accept the April 25, 2016 meeting minutes as presented. Motion carried 4 to 0.

2. Approval and signing of orders:

The board approved and signed the orders drawn on the Treasurer for week 18.

3. Bandstand Park Request:

Motion made by Chris Hunter, seconded by Ray Durocher to grant the use of Bandstand Park to the Farmer's Market, with electricity for a fee of \$25, from May 20<sup>th</sup> to October 14<sup>th</sup> between the hours of 3 and 6 PM. Motion carried 4-0.

The Farmer's Market also requested the use of the Municipal Office Building to store trash cans, tables, chairs, extension cord and a tent. Justin Smith, Municipal Administrator and Dawn Dwyer, Clerk & Treasurer, had already determined there was not any available storage space in the Municipal Building. Justin will inform the Farmer's Market.

4. Water Connection Applications:

Motion made by Chris Hunter, Seconded by Ray Durocher, to approve the residential Application for Water Connection application for Tim Chamberlin to be located at 7 Calista Avenue. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion made by Ray Durocher, seconded by Chris Hunter, to approve the Fire Protection Application for ABFB Corp. to be located at 69 Church Street. Motion carried 4-0.

5. Kingdom Trails Bicycle Decoration Request:

Kingdom Trails Association are partnering with Catamount Arts and the Lyndonville Chamber of Commerce to bring juried high end Bike Art to be displayed at their bike festival in June then at local businesses for the remainder of the summer. They are requesting to hang used bikes, painted red, white and blue, from the light poles along Depot Street for the summer. Justin Smith ran the idea by Ken Mason, Manager of Lyndonville Electric Department, and Ken does not have any issues with the project. The motion was made by Chris Hunter, seconded by Ray Durocher, to approve the Bike Art with the conditions that they be maintained to appealing to the eye and no loose, falling pieces. Motion carried 4-0.

6. Village Ordinance Discussion:

Chief Jack Harris would like to update the Village Ordinance, Chapter 7 "Rules for Bicycles, Skateboards, Scooters, Roller Skates, and Roller Blades" to include Longboards as well as increase the violation fine from ten dollars (\$10)(waiver fine \$5) to fifty dollars (\$50)(waiver fine \$25). The Police

Department has the discretion to allow the above mentioned vehicles to operate properly in the new bike lanes. Chief Harris will revise the ordinance and give to Justin Smith, Municipal Administrator.

Joe Dauphin, Public Works Supervisor, would like to address the parking on the west side of Church Street from the Fire Department south to the new daycare, to not allow parking on the green strip. Chief Harris will work with Joe to review all the streets in the Village. Chief Harris will revise the ordinance and forward to Justin.
