1. After completing the LED agenda Chris Hunter called the Trustees meeting to order at 6:11 PM.
2. Adjustments to the Agenda: None
3. Minutes: Susan Mills made a motion to approve the minutes from June 3rd, 2019. Chris Hunter seconded, and the motion carried 4-0.
4. Sign Revenue Anticipation Note Paperwork: Heather Bollman made a motion to approve the signing of the Revenue Anticipation Note for \$300,000 @ an interest rate of 2.19% from Passumpsic Savings Bank. Chris Hunter seconded, and the motion carried 4-0.
5. Grants-in-Aid Participation Form: Susan Mills made a motion to approve the Village's continued participation in the grants-in aid program. The program provides funds based on a Municipality's road mileage. The program offers each participating municipality a maximum (not to exceed) award amount and will pay up to 80% of the cost of an approved stormwater project which is deemed to be hydrologically connected to a stream, river, pond, or lake. Chris Hunter seconded, and the motion carried 4-0.
6. Stars and Stripes Donation Request: The Chamber of Commerce sent letters seeking donation for the Stars & Stripes parade. The Trustees decided that it would not be an appropriate allocation of taxpayer funds.
7. Village Parking Space Use: The Village of Lyndonville received concerns from Michael Murphy regarding Village Parking relating to the allowance of a pizza vendor to use a Village parking space and how that action by the Trustees pushed another vehicle into the parking area in front of his house. He also expressed concerns over the use the parking in the park by the Town's 3rd floor tenants and by employees of nearby businesses. The Municipal Administrator noted that the Public Works Department would be adding one additional sign to the area to address the midnight- 7:00 AM parking ban. The Trustees decided that at this point it was time to put closure to the issue surrounding the parking in the park. A letter will be written stating the park is a public park, the parking is here to stay, all Village public parking is free for use by the general public within the constraints of the Village ordinances.

While on the subject of Village parking Chris Hunter asked for clarification as to the reasoning for not allowing parking on the green space on the east side of Williams Street? It was to prevent damage to the curb stops, fix an aesthetics issue because the green areas had been reduced to dirt, and finally to save on maintenance costs of seeding, mulch and staking grassed areas twice a year that were getting destroyed each spring and fall.

8. Other: Chris Hunter noted that he felt some properties in the Village were not following the trash ordinance and were either leaving their trash barrels out at the sidewalk permanently or were at the very minimum putting them out prior to 24 hours before pick-up.
9. Having no other business the meeting was adjourned at 7:09 PM.
